What is a SEAP?

Key part of the E.U. covenant of Mayors to tackle climate change. The SEAP is a framework / process to pull together key agents across Districts / LCR to address climate change and meet EU Covenant of Mayors obligation:

- Baseline emissions inventory (1990);
- Submit SEAP detailed 20% reduction in CO2 by 2020;
- Update and republish every 2 years;
- Could include LCR carbon vision;
- Establish strategic aims;
- Set out programme of action LA projects, partnership projects, private sector / network projects.
