District Heating is developing rapidly in the UK, with many local authorities, housing associations, health and university estates currently developing plans for installing heating networks.

Denmark has long been a leader in District Heating. District Heating covers more than 60% of space heating and water in Denmark, with over 80% of this heat produced by Combined Heat & Power (CHP) plants. Most major cities also have large District Heating Networks.

There is much to learn from the Danish experience, and also a wealth of knowledge and technologies established there that the UK can benefit from.

Following on from successful visits to Edinburgh and London in recent years, a consortium of Danish organisations are visiting the North of England from the 3rd – 5th November 2015, hosted by Manchester and Leeds City Councils. You are invited to join them for a series of free seminars and 1-2-1 meetings.
